

My Mosler Biography:

<u>Bob Gould</u> – In 1956, while still in college, I was Hired by Newt Kruge as a Temporary Mosler Summer Employee, working as a draftsman for Dick Scully in Hamilton Bank Engineering.

After completing school, I received a call from Mosler. The company had hired Dee Grover, to organize their service operation and he wanted to talk to me about a position in the new department. During our interview, he explained his vision of the new organization and how it would require printed service instructions and catalogs to assist field service. While a trained illustrator, I knew nothing about the materials he described. That small fact did not deter him. I started in 1960 and was the second person he hired. As Manager of Service Publications over the years, I worked for Jack Smith, Ed Heinemann, Cliff O'Dell and Joe Wolpin.

I often reflect on the enormous influence Mr. Grover and Jack Smith had on my entire working career. I'm certain many others shared this same experience.

After 15 years in the Installation & Service Division, I transferred to Marketing Communications, reporting to Bob Myron. I was responsible for Trade Shows, Printed Brochures, Trade Advertising and other sales aids required for Bank Vault and all other systems manufactured in Hamilton.

I resigned from Mosler 1n 1978 to accept an executive position with Ed Mulvey at Saft America in Valdosta, Georgia. My wife Lee and I are now happily retired in Sunny Valdosta, Georgia. Our two daughters, Michelle and Angela, reside in Gainesville, Florida.
