

My Mosler Biography:

<u>Richard "Dick" Dyer -</u> I joined Mosler in the summer of 1968. Dan Hobbs, V.P. of Industrial Relations at Mosler, hired me to manage the Industrial Relations department for the Bank & Commercial Division. This included two plants in Hamilton; the lock plant at Milford; Wayne, New Jersey; Buffalo and Franklinville in New York; Grandview, Missouri; and the Herman Safe Co. in San Francisco, California. My primary responsibility was Labor Relations. All but two of the facilities were unionized. I also supervised the various personnel managers with our responsibilities for Employment, Training, Benefits, Wage and Salary Administration, the Medical Department, and Security, etc.
