

My Mosler Biography:

<u>Lu Johnson</u> - My twenty-two years with Mosler S.I.S. Group began as Secretary to Robert Fritsch. We were first housed in the Reed Building on Pleasant Avenue, then moved to the American Standard Building on Route 4.

Bob Fritsch left Mosler, and I then reported to Robert Soaper. We, and the S.I.S. Accounting group, were at one end of this one-story building; Mr. MacDonald, Paul Jeanmougin and Marty Brown were among those at the other end.

Bob Soaper and I were moved to Belle Avenue, and after a short time, I became Secretary to Robert Sedman at Grand Boulevard. Tom Connaughton and Richard Henry made up our group of four, and I provided any secretarial help they needed.

My next move was to become Secretary to James Flanagan, still at the Grand Boulevard location. When Jim left this position, he was replaced by Michael Mattingly and I remained as Secretary to Mike.

The new Education Center Building on Berk Boulevard opened, and Mike and I, along with the S.I.S. Accounting Group, were among those moved to that building.

I remained there until Peg Haker retired and I returned to Grand Boulevard; this time to replace Peg as Secretary to Joseph Lingg. I held that position until retiring in 1992.
