

My Mosler Biography:

<u>Maurice R. Jones</u> - I joined Mosler 1954 as a casual worker in Portland, Oregon. In 1956, I was hired by Charlie Ryan, Northwest District Manager. As a service tech, I covered Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana, Utah and Alaska. In 1961, I moved to Seattle where I opened the Seattle branch.

In April 1967, A.D. Grover asked me to move to Hamilton. My wife, Sharon, and I arrived in Hamilton on July 4, 1967. Upon arrival, I initially reported to Mr. Grover, and was assigned to the Illustration Department.

Over the following years, I did a variety of things beginning with writing service manuals, parts catalogs, installation and service bulletins and quick reference guides. I provided technical support to the field, covering all bank and commercial products. Then I joined the Training Department where I helped develop and implement training courses for all Mosler physical security products, including timelocks and GSA products.

Eventually, I became a Senior Product Specialist and Installation Engineer. I was responsible for servicing the National Archives Vault. I taught GSA product classes at the Garney Safe Co. in Germany, and supervised the installation of missile doors at two nuclear power plants, as well as some specially built vault doors for the Church of Spiritual Technology.

I retired from Mosler on May 30, 1993. After a year as managing editor of the SAVTA trade magazine in Dallas, I returned as a consultant in the Mosler Parts Department. I was at my desk when a banker exited a nearby room talking on a cell phone. I heard him say, "I'm shutting them down."

My wife Sharon and I now live in Fairfield, Ohio. We have a son who also lives in Fairfield and a married daughter who lives in Katy, Texas.
