

My Mosler Biography:

<u>Sam Benzinger</u> – I joined Mosler Lock Co. in Milford, Ohio in January of 1966, starting out in the Mill Department. My foreman's name was Lloyd Potts; Fred Huber was the Vice President at the time.

Six months later, Mosler bought a Cintimatic tape controlled milling machine, and I ran it for about twenty years. Times got tough, and they put me in a new department called MS 410 where we made parts for Document Retrieval systems. We also made Safety Deposit Boxes among other parts.

In 1986 the Lock factory was closed. I went to CAD school for a year. Then I called Charlie Schottner and asked if I could go to work for the Mosler Safe Company – and he said yes!

I went to work there running the same machine that I had run in Milford for about twenty-three years. I also ran CNC's for two years, and when Mosler bought a new Cutting Laser, I was sent to Chicago for specialized training so I could operate the new machine. During my remaining time at Mosler, I ran the Laser and reported to Dowell Goe.

My wife Sandra and I now live in Lebanon, Ohio where I work for Tomak Precision, Inc which manufactures Mosler replacement parts as one of its various products.
