

My Mosler Biography:

Terry Klinzing – My association with Mosler began in June 1968 with the Mosler R.E.A.C.H. program- rewards through activity and challenge. A group of us were paid minimum wage to take a summer workshop covering vocational topics such as shop math, metal FAB, welding, and machine operations, taught by Hamilton vocational instructors Joe Kaufmann and Darrell Baker.
