

My Mosler Biography:

Tom Frederick - I started at Mosler in 1956 as a Milling Machine Trainee working for Robert Meiner. After a brief layoff, I rejoined the "Lock Repair Department" reporting to Cecil King. I had the opportunity to transfer to the new National Service group but decided to stay in manufacturing. In following years, I held various positions in inspection and product assembly.

After completing the Supervisor Training Program, I was promoted to Supervisor in the Safe Deposit Box assembly and SD Door manufacturing area where I worked for Joe Treinen, Robert Smith and Don Koenig. I later replaced Cecil King in the Bank Vault product area, after he retired.

I worked for several years in machining departments as a supervisor until I moved into Manufacturing Engineering as a CNC Programmer and Operator Trainer for the Vertical Machining Center. I left Mosler for 2 years, but was soon recruited and returned as a routing specialist and shop coordinator for a special vault door project. Not long afterward, Mosler ceased manufacturing operations but I continued as a coordinator with the supplier who had contracted to complete the special vault door project.

While working with the contractor, I applied and was accepted for the position of Technical Support Representative-Barrier Products, at Berk Blvd., reporting to Jim Gels. I remained in this position until the day that Mosler closed, logging 47 total years with the company.
