

**My Mosler Biography:**

**Frank Everett** – I was hired by Jim Bell, BSM in Oklahoma City on October 1, 1968. Training as a Service Technician with Jimmy Dye, and formal Product training by Maurice Jones and Al Billota prepared me for a position as a resident service technician and relocation to Lubbock, Texas in 1969.

I serviced the west Texas and New Mexico resident area prepared before me by Jimmy Wilson. My teammate in Lubbock was Frank Waldorf. We became lifelong, personal friends as we represented Mosler in a large geographical area. Dave Coleman was our RSM in Dallas, TX.

I installed the first online ATM Tellermatic in the nation, training for this and other electronic security and remote transaction systems. Managers included Hank Green and Helmut Knefely in Dallas. In 1980, I returned to Oklahoma City and worked with Jim Riley, Al Baird, Betty Fish, Vernon Kinslow, Michael Leader, Leonard Carden, Gary Horvath, David Clark, Tim Williams and Area Manager Ron Barnett. As newer systems were introduced, I serviced personal computers, energy management and satellite communications as well as ATMs.

I stayed with Mosler until the end, having enjoyed thirty-two and a half years of a great and satisfying career. I live in the Oklahoma City area with my wife Charma, and look back fondly on the experiences and wonderful people who were a part of my career at Mosler. It was a great ride.
